# Will EContra One-Step protect me against sexually transmitted diseases (STDs)?

No, it will not protect you against STDs or HIV (AIDS).<sup>2</sup> Only condoms can protect you from STDs.<sup>4</sup>

#### Are there any side effects?

Side effects may include changes in your period, nausea, stomach pain, tiredness, headache, dizziness, and breast tenderness.<sup>2</sup>
